Free School Meals FAQs



What criteria do I need to meet?

Your child must attend a maintained school or receive alternative education approved by Kent County Council.

Children attending private or independent schools cannot get Free School Meals.

Your child may be eligible for Free School Meals if you are in receipt of the following:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- · Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax
 Credit.

Do I need to make a new application, if my child is moving to a Kent school from out of the area and already receives Free School Meals?

No, you do not need to complete a new application. Your child's previous school should be able to send confirmation to the new school, advising them that your child is already receiving Free School Meals and the school will manage this locally.

What if my child's school does not appear on the dropdown list when I am making an application?

If your child's school does not appear on the dropdown list, this will be because the school do not use our Free School Meals service. You will therefore need to contact the school directly, to find out their process.

What should I do if my application is found to be 'not eligible', but I believe it should be?

If an application is found not eligible, it may not necessarily mean that you do not meet the criteria. It may be that you have entered information incorrectly (such as NI number and DOB) so please check all information you have entered. If you are new to receiving a benefit, our system may not be able to pick up your circumstance straight away. This means that we will need to investigate your application a little further.

If you believe your application should be eligible, please email us at freeschoolmeals@kent.gov.uk confirming your name, your child's name, DOB and application reference number and send us evidence of your benefits. If the evidence provided, meets the criteria to make an application eligible, we can amend this on the system.

Do I need to make a new application each year?

No, you will only need to apply once, unless advised otherwise by us directly. You do not need to submit a new application each year.

Do I need to advise you if my child moves school over the summer?

Prior to the summer holidays, we contact the schools that use our system, asking them to list the children leaving their school and confirm which school they are moving to. Providing they are moving to another school that use our system, we make the swap over the summer, ready for the new school year. You can liaise with your child's new school once they start, to ensure the changes have been made.

Why is my eldest child eligible for Free School Meals, but my younger child is not?

Your eldest child may be eligible due to the Free School Meals Protection Act. Your eligibility for Free School Meals is based on your circumstances at the time the application is made. This means that younger children will not become entitled to Free School Meals simply because their older sibling is in receipt of them already, if circumstances have changed since the eldest child's application was made. If you were eligible at the time your older child's application was made, this would be eligible and remain protected until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2023, or until, but if your circumstances have since changed and you would no longer be entitled to Free School Meals, the new application will be found 'not eligible'.

What is "Transitional Protection"?

From 1 April 2018, transitional protections were implemented for pupils who might otherwise have lost Free School Meals following the update to the eligibility criteria. The transitional protections were awarded as follows:

- Any pupil who is in receipt of Free School Meals immediately prior to 1 April 2018 will
 continue to receive Free School Meals whilst Universal Credit is rolled out. This
 applies even if they no longer meet the eligibility criteria during that time.
- Any pupil who gains eligibility for Free School Meals after 1 April 2018 will continue to receive Free School Meals during the Universal Credit rollout period. This applies even if they no longer meet the eligibility criteria at a subsequent point during the rollout period.

Once Universal Credit is fully rolled out, any existing pupil who no longer meets the eligibility criteria at that point will continue to receive Free School Meals until the end of their current phase of education, i.e. primary or secondary, that they are in on 31 March 2023.

What do I need to do if my financial circumstances change?
