

Programme of study Year 3 2023 - 2024

English

The children follow the National English Curriculum, spending a minimum of 5 hours a week pursuing prescribed English activities. These activities include text mapping, comprehension, spelling, grammar and writing. We also attach considerable importance to the acquisition of speaking and listening skills. Coverage includes: historical settings, performance poetry, recounts in newspapers, creating images in poetry, imaginary stories, explanation text, stories from other cultures, stories with dilemmas, information texts, plays and persuasive texts. As a school, we adopt a continuous cursive handwriting (joined).

<u>Maths</u>

The Maths Curriculum provides the children with the opportunity to develop their abilities in mental calculations. The children learn through a whole class teaching approach as well as differentiated work. They have daily maths lessons, which cover the areas of number, place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, problem solving, data handling, measuring, money, time, shape and space.

P.E kit: Please refer to updated PE kit list:

Only on PE days children should wear full PE kit.

- PE kit is: all-black trainers, sports socks, drawstring sports shorts, plain black jogging bottoms (unbranded, no logos), white or red polo top and school sweatshirt/ cardigan (no hoodies).
- No jewellery, including earrings, should be worn on those days.
- Children may wear PE shorts on warmer days. These must be plain, black school sports shorts (not cycling shorts).
- On colder days the children can wear black jogging bottoms (not leggings)







Homework

In Year 3 there is an expectation that children will be reading most evenings for at least 20 minutes increasing over the year to 30 minutes. Reading books will be changed by children when needed, if there is a signature in their reading record, and on Wednesdays for any phonics books. It is very important in Year 3 that you discuss the book with your child to ensure that they have a good understanding of the book they have read. They need to be able to predict and give their opinion on a text. Modelling reading to your child can also have a great impact on their own reading skills.

Comprehension, maths and any other homework will be given out every Thursday and will be expected to

be handed in the following Wednesday, unless a date is specified.

Weekly spellings will be set and tested every Friday and the children are expected to learn them as part of their homework.
