Attendance

Attendance is essential to helping children reach their full potential. If children are absent they miss valuable learning experiences, have gaps in their curriculum knowledge and compromise crucial academic times such as Phonics and SATs.

We must work together to emphasise the importance of attendance and punctuality. All pupils should have at least 96% attendance in a school year, which already makes allowances for the normal rate of ill health.

The school will NOT be able to authorise any holidays in term time. Permission for absence from school can only be granted in exceptional circumstances and this no longer includes holidays.



About Year 1....

Your child has now moved from 'Early Years (Reception)' to 'Key Stage 1'

There will be a few differences in your child's learning this year. A big change will be that the children will begin to move away from free-flow activities to more formal learning. This is where we will sit down and do our learning as a class. The children are currently in a transition period, where we are using a mixture of formal learning and activities in the afternoon to ensure a smooth and fun transition.

The children will still have lots of opportunities to learn through play and experimenting in our fun, practical and engaging lessons. They will not be sat down all day!

The children will have daily Phonics, Maths and English lessons. In Year 1, children will take their Phonics Screening Check in June.

Our playtime will be from 10.25-10.40 where the children will be provided with a fruit snack. Our lunch time will be from 11.40-.12-45.

Important Days!

Homework: Children will be given homework appropriate to their needs and learning. We ask parents to support with this and help make this a positive, valuable experience. Homework will begin in week 3 and will be given out on a Friday and to be handed in the following Thursday.

Spellings: Children will be given spellings from Term 2. Spelling tests will take place every Friday.

Reading books: Children will take home one phonics book, linked to their Read Write Inc level and one reading for pleasure book from their book corner. Books will be handed in on a Thursday and go home on a Friday– please **ensure your child brings their books every day.**

PE day: Stargazers will have PE on Tuesday afternoons and Navigators will have PE on Thursday afternoons. The children will need to come to school in their PE kit on these days.

Phonics Screening Check

What is the Phonics Screening Check?

Children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week **from the 8th June.**

What happens during the test?

The test contains 40 words. Each child sits one to one and reads each word aloud to their teacher. The test will take approximately 10 minutes per child, although all children are different and will complete the check at their own pace. The list of words the children read is a combination of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words (nonsense words). These words will be shown to your child with a picture of an alien. This provides the children with a context for the alien word which is independent from any existing vocabulary they may have. Aliens words are included because they will be new to all pupils and will assess your child's Phonics knowledge.

Reporting to Parents

By the end of the summer term schools must report results of the check to parents in their summer report. They will also confirm if the child has met the standard threshold. Children who do not achieve the expected level will retake the test when they are in Year 2.

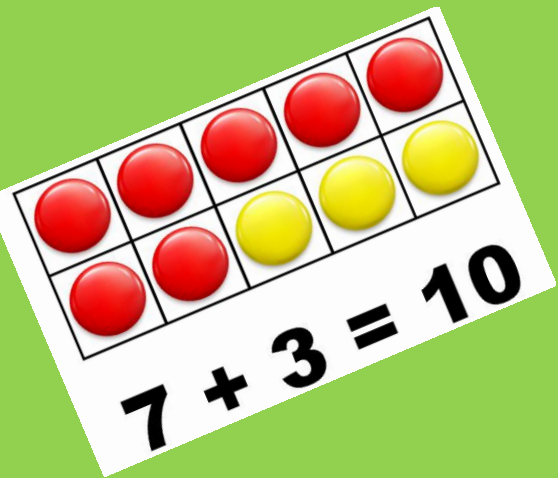

PE KIT

1. PE kit is: all-black trainers, sports socks, drawstring sports shorts, plain black jogging bottoms (unbranded, no logos), white or red polo top and school sweatshirt/ cardigan (no hoodies).
2. No jewellery, including earrings, should be worn on those days.
3. Children may wear PE shorts on warmer days. These must be plain, black school sports shorts (not cycling shorts).
4. On colder days the children can wear black jogging bottoms (not leggings)
